MODELFiesta XXIV RULES, CATEGORIES, AND AWARDS

RULES

1. Category placement, splits, and judging decisions are the responsibility of the contest committee.
2. Judging will be by the committee system.
3. Entries must be the sole work of the entrant except in categories specifically allowing for two or more builders (group/club entries). Commercially built and finished models that do not require significant additional work by the modeler are not allowed. Pre-decorated assembly kits may be entered, but MUST be accompanied by kit instructions.
4. Entries by proxy are welcomed. Entrant must include the actual builder's name on the entry form.
5. Models that have received ANY award at an IPMS National contest, or 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place at any previous Region VI Regional contest or ModelFiesta are ineligible for competition. They may, however, be placed in the designated "display only" area(s).
6. Models in box -stock categories MUST be accompanied by the kit instructions. Modeler may fill seams; sand off rivets; drill out gun ports, exhaust pipes, or other appropriate openings; thin to scale such parts as trailing edges, flaps, and doors; add rigging and antennas; and add simple tape or decal seatbelts (NO commercial or modeler manufactured hardware). Photo-etched, cast metal or resin parts are permitted if included in the original kit and so identified in the kit instructions. Articulating /separating kit parts or including non-kit parts are not allowed. Finish and markings options are unrestricted.
7. Conversions are significant changes to the original kit in order to depict a different variant of the original subject. Builder must detail changes made to the basic model on the entry sheet or accompanying documentation.
8. Scratch built models must not have been significantly derived from any existing kit. Kit parts may be used, but their use should be generally unrelated to their original identity, except for detail parts. Detail parts (wheels, guns, etc) may come from any source.
9. *Alamo Squadron respects and admires the skill and artistry of all builders and their models, regardless of subject. Be advised, however, that in the interests of public decency and local sensibilities, no lewd/sexually explicit, obscene or offensive subjects will be accepted for entry or display at the discretion of the contest committee.*
10. It is possible models may be handled by contest staff when necessary to facilitate positioning or judging. Bases reduce risks involved with moving entries, but are not required. Base-mounted entries should be of reasonable size (fit the kit). Entrants

should indicate whether or not a model is attached to its base.
