MODELFiesta XXV RULES, CATEGORIES, AND AWARDS

RULES

1. The ModelFiesta Committee is responsible for all category placement, splits, and judging decisions.
2. Judging will be closed and will be by the committee system.
3. Entries must be the sole work of the entrant except those in Category 505. Proxies are permitted and the entrant must include the actual builder's name on the entry form. Commercially built and/or finished models that do not require significant additional work by the modeler are not allowed. Pre-decorated assembly kits may be entered, but MUST be accompanied by the kit instructions.
4. Models that have received ANY award at IPMS Nationals, a Region 6 Convention or a ModelFiesta are ineligible for competition, but may be placed in the designated "display only" area.
5. Models in box-stock categories MUST be accompanied by the kit instructions. Modeler may fill seams; sand off rivets; drill out gun ports, exhaust pipes, or other appropriate openings; thin to scale such parts as trailing edges, flaps, and doors; add rigging and antennas; and add simple tape or decal seatbelts (NO commercial or modeler-made hardware). Photo-etched, cast metal or resin parts are permitted if included in the original kit and so identified in the kit instructions. Articulating/separating kit parts or including non-kit parts is not allowed. Finish and markings are unrestricted.
6. Conversions are significant changes to the original kit in order to depict a different variant of the original subject. Use of **after** market conversion parts in this category is not allowed. Builder must detail changes made to the basic model on the entry sheet or in accompanying documentation.
7. Scratchbuilt models may use parts from other kits, but their use should be unrelated to their original identity, except detail parts. Detail parts (wheels, guns, etc) may come from any source.
8. *Alamo Squadron respects and admires the skill and artistry of all builders and their models, regardless of subject. Be advised, however, that in the interests of public decency and local sensibilities, no lewd/sexually explicit, obscene or offensive subjects will be accepted for entry or display at the discretion of the ModelFiesta committee.*
9. Models may be handled by contest staff and judges when necessary to fairly evaluate the entry. Placing the model on a base will assist in the safe movement of the model. Bases are not required but if used should fit the size of the model and the builder MUST indicate if the model is attached to its base.
